MAIN DIVISION BENCH & STAFF

In terms of Article 80 of the Constitution the High Court consists of the Judge President and additional judges presided over by the Judge President. During the 2020 Legal Year the High Court, Main Division bench consisted of the Judge President, the Deputy Judge President and 14 additional judges, four of which were assigned to the criminal stream and 10 of which were assigned to the civil & labour stream. The President on recommendation of the Judicial Service commission appointed four acting judges during the course of the year in support of the permanent judges.

The High Court bench was supported by a total of 72 supporting staff members, of which 20 are professional staff, which include the registrar and legal officers. The remaining 52 supporting staff members include administrative staff, legal clerks, secretaries, cleaners, messengers and drivers.

A number of key positions, such as the Deputy Registrar and the chief legal officer judicial support positions remained vacant for the majority of the 2020 legal year, which brought about its own challenges.

Both the bench compliment as well as the staffing compliment remained more or less the same with the bench and staff compliment during the 2019 legal year.

The comparison between the 2019 Legal Year and the 2020 Legal Year of the bench and staff compliment is more or less equal with a bench of 19 judges comprising of 11 permanent judges and eight acting judges during the 2019 Legal Year and a bench of 18 judges comprising of 14 permanent judges and four acting judges during the 2020 Legal Year. The support staff however showed a 5% reduction from 2019 with a decrease of 4 staff members on the staff compliment.¹

MAIN DIVISION CIVIL STREAM

Civil and Labour cases in the High Court resort under the civil stream and may be divided in two types, namely Residual Court cases and cases subjected to Judicial Case Management.

NUMBER OF CASES

During the 2020 Legal Year the High Court issued 321 substantive civil and labour applications and reviews, of which 195 were brought as urgent applications, 5198 summonses and 9 electoral court cases. Included in the 321 applications issued were 78 applications for admission as legal practitioner. A total of 6 new civil appeals and 73 labour appeals were registered.

A reduction of 30% in the amount of substantive applications and reviews were observed from the 2019 Legal Year, whilst the number of summonses issued during the 2020 Legal were issued and 4979 summonses). It is difficult to determine the cause for the fluctuation in figures, but it is evident that the State of Emergency did not have a substantial influence on the number of new civil labour and labour cases received by the High Court. The High Court's electronic case management system, giving access to court services online definitely contributed towards this. ²

RESIDUAL COURT

During the 2020 Legal Year 156 residual court sessions for undefended and unopposed matters were scheduled with a total of 5883 cases enrolled on the respective rolls. The majority of the orders were issued from chambers in absentia of the parties, which contributed a great deal to service delivery during lockdown. ³ The State of Emergency and in particular the Lockdown and the restriction on travel between different districts did have an impact on the speedy finalisation of undefended matrimonial matters, since the appearance of the Plaintiff is a requirement, but any such delays were wiped and we are proud to say that we do not have any backlog on our residual court roll.

JUDICIAL CASE MANAGEMENT

It goes without question that the Judicial Case Management system contributes towards speedy and effective finalisation of defended and opposed matters, but it requires intensive labour and attention by our managing judges. The amount of judges available to manage the cases subjected to judicial case management is simply not enough with our action stream managing close to 600 cases each and the motion judges close to 200 cases each during the 2020 Legal Year. Despite these challenges our judges performed well having regard to the on time delivery of judgments and the finalisation figure of the civil cases.

On 1 January 2020, the beginning of the 2020 Legal year a total number of 1857 cases subjected to Judicial Case Management were brought forward from the previous legal years. A total number of 2994 matters became subjected to Judicial Case Management during the

2020 Legal Year. A total number of 4851 were thus under JCM during the past year. The judges managed to finalise 2663 of the 4851 cases on the JCM roll. This amounts to a finalisation figure of 55% of all cases subjected to JCM during 2020. Two thousand and eighty nine (2189) matters were carried over to the 2021 JCM roll⁴.

We experienced an increase of 418 matters on the JCM roll in comparison with the 2019 Legal Year, which may also be the explanation for the decrease in the finalisation figure from 58% to 55%. The 2019 Legal Year reflected a total number of 4433 cases subjected to JCM of which 2557 were finalised during the same period.

JUDGMENT DELIVERY

The judges in the civil stream delivered 391 reasoned judgments and/or ruling during the 2020 Legal Year of which 77% were delivered within the prescribed timelines. The judges in the Main Division, Civil stream delivered 34 judgments more than during the 2019 legal year and increased their on time delivery performance from 71% to 77%.⁵

DISPOSAL RATE OF CASES

Main Division dealt with a total of 9893 cases of which 6133 were finalised during the 2020 Legal Year. 4438 of the 6133 matters finalised were finalised within the prescribed disposal benchmarks. The on time disposal rate of cases in the Main Division was therefore 57% in the motion stream and 74% in the action stream with a combined rate of 72%.⁶

The impact of the State of Emergency is probably most evident when the 2020 on time disposal rate is compared with the 2019 on time disposal rate, since we observed a decrease of 7% in the on time disposal rate of civil cases from the previous year.

During the 2019 Legal Year the High Court dealt with 8075 cases and finalised 4792 cases of which 3772 cases were finalised within the required timelines. (79%)⁷

MEDIATIONS

It is a well-known fact that the Mediation Initiative in the High Court is a success story. The 2020 State of Emergency however contributed to this success story. The State of Emergency forced this section of the Main Division to rely on internal teamwork and extra hours which resulted in a challenged being converted into a success story.

During the 2020 Legal Year 1023 mediations were scheduled in the Main Division whilst 852 were scheduled during the 2019 Legal Year. This increase may be partially be explained by the 152 cancellations compared with the 35 cancellations during 2019, which was necessitated with the announcement of the State of Emergency. The increase in the number of cases this year also contributed towards the increased number of mediations.

We did not conduct any mediations during the period 27 March 2020 – 10 May 2020. Mediations were resumed on 11 May 2020, but with strict compliance to the Covid Regulations. The team relied heavily on mediators in the employ of the Office of the Judiciary which contributed to the Revenue saving if compared with 2019. The first Mediation after lock down conducted by an external mediator was on 18 September 2020.

The 2020 Legal Year thus resulted in 1023 mediations being set down of which 135 mediations were cancelled. 582 of the 888 mediations which remained enrolled were successful and 288 failed. 18 Mediations are still unaccounted for since they were conducted during the month of December and the reports will only be filed after the High Court resumes its duties on 18 January 2021. 67% of all mediations conducted were successful whilst only 57% of the mediations conducted during 2019 were successful.

The Revenue expense in respect of the 2020 Mediations amounted to N\$954B762 compared to the amount of N\$1 821 154 expenditure during 2019.

The successful mediations during 2020 amounted to a saving of at least N\$ 58 300 000 in the hands of the various High Court litigants and 2332 court days for the bench.⁸

MAIN DIVISION CRIMINAL STREAM

INDICTMENT CASES

A total number of 66 indictment cases were brought forward from the 2019 Legal Year and 22 new indictments were received and registered during the 2020 Legal Year. The High Court finalised 26 of the 88 criminal indictment cases amounting to 30% of the cases being finalised. The finalisation figure during 2019 was also 30%, which is indicative that the State of Emergency did not have an impact on the disposal of criminal cases, but merely caused a delay in the duration of the cases.⁹

The 62 cases which remain on the 2021 court roll are enrolled for continuation of trial (37), plea & trial (14) and mentions roll (8). Three matters are being removed from the roll since the accused persons absconded.

The 26 matters finalised during 2020 contained one or more charges of crimes relating to violence against women (17 cases), crimes of dishonesty (7 cases). The 62 remaining matters on the 2021 roll comprises of cases with one or more charges of crimes relating to violence against women (39 cases), crimes of dishonesty (24 cases) and human trafficking / kidnapping (7 cases). Some of these cases resort under more than one of the three categories.

CRIMINAL APPEALS

On 1 January 2020 63 criminal appeal matters were brought forward from the previous year and 110 new criminal appeal matters were registered. We finalised 153 matters finalised during the 2020 Legal Year. The finalisation figure amounted to 88% in comparison with a finalisation figure of 69% during the 2019 Legal Year.¹⁰

PRESIDENT'S PATIENT DISCHARGE APPLICATIONS

During the 2020 Legal Year the High Court received 14 new applications for discharge of President's Patients and one applications referred back to the Prosecutor General during 2019. All matter were finalised and the recommendations were delivered the Honourable President for consideration.

CRIMINAL REVIEWS

The Main Division received 2032 new criminal reviews from the Magistrates' Courts of which 1764 were finalised prior to the end of the legal year. The finalisation figure amounted to 87% and is thus shadowed by the 93% finalisation figure achieved during 2019.¹¹

CRIMINAL STREAM JUDGMENTS AND RULINGS

The Main Division delivered 84 reasoned judgments / rulings in indictment cases, 46 reasoned judgments / rulings in criminal appeal matters and 119 criminal review judgments during the 2020 Legal Year. The on time delivery rate for 2020 is 88%. ¹² The on time delivery of judgments during the 2019 Legal Year was 81%.

2020 ACHIEVEMENTS

1. The High Court, Main Division despite the State of Emergency and its various stages managed to:
 - 1.1. Provide service to all without the need to close it's doors;
 - 1.2. Wipe the backlog accumulated during the State of Emergency in
 - 1.2.1. Mediations within a period of 2 ½ months;
 - 1.2.2. Residual Court (Civil and Labour) within a period of 1 month;
 - 1.2.3. Judicial Case Management proceedings within a period of 1 ½ month;
 - 1.3. Provide set down dates to all civil trials matters which required hearing dates within six months from date of such request (which five months include 1 month court recess);
 - 1.4. Issue court process, irrespective of the numbers received on any given day, within 24 hours from being submitted for issuance;
 - 1.5. Accommodate appeal hearings, interlocutory hearings and opposed motions without interruption by either video conferencing or by agreement to decide the matter on the papers before court;
 - 1.6. Implement policies to combat Covid-19 spread without interrupting service delivery, i.e. strict 1st person isolation, demarcation polies and cleaning and disinfecting policies
2. Complete stake holder consultation on the draft amendment to the Rules of Court;
3. Inaugurate the Commercial section of the High Court, introducing state of the art technology which include video conferencing facilities, dual monitor display, & video recording of all procedure;
4. Convert a boardroom in a virtual court room with video conferencing facilities.
5. The Main Division currently have 3 court rooms equipped with video conferencing facilities in order to accommodate virtual proceedings.
6. Introduce the new mediation and arbitration facility at the High Court which include 6 mediation rooms, a mediation process office and offices for in-house mediators;
7. The appointment of 3 permanent judges, one in the criminal stream and 2 in the civil stream.

CHALLENGES FACED DURING THE YEAR 2020

1. Renovation and building work done whilst the court is operational
2. Finding suitable candidates to fill professional vacancies
3. Budget constraints
4. State of Emergency
5. Not enough judges to cater for the amount of civil and labour cases subjected to Judicial Case Management

NEW INITIATIVES AND PROGRAMS PLANNED FOR 2021

1. Appointment of suitable candidates in key positions which remained vacant for a year and longer;
2. Finalisation of phase 1 of the High Court renovation project;
3. Continued training of judges and staff;
4. Introduction of rules of court applicable to commercial disputes;
5. Appointment of permanent judges for both Main Division and Northern Local Division.

IMPACT OF STATE OF EMERGENCY ON COURT FUNCTIONS

SERVICES RENDERED

Lockdown Period

1. During Lockdown, restricted services within limited hours were delivered, as per Proclamation and Regulations
2. Most Legal Practitioner's firms were closed wherefore we received very few process for issuance.
3. The High Court civil and labour litigation are done electronically wherefore all documents received for processing were attended to during Lockdown
4. Definite decrease in revenue collected, complete stand still on criminal proceedings and limited processes submitted for processing in labour and civil litigation. Indicate a huge impact on operations in Legal sector with huge financial impact for all.

Stages 2, 3 and 4

1. No restrictions on services rendered or hours.
2. Mediations were though restricted to one mediation per session (3 sessions per day).
Reason:
 - a. Until 4 September we only had one venue big enough to observe social distancing. Mediations only performed by our in-house mediator, Mr Nederlof;
 - b. From 7 September we have 6+ venues suitable to observe social distancing and the number of mediations per session were drastically increased. Mediations performed by In-House mediator as well as legal officers of Supreme & High Court who are also accredited mediators.

3. From beginning of October mediations were increased to 8 mediations per session (3 sessions per day) conducted by In-House mediator, legal officers of Supreme & High Court who are also accredited mediators, as well as external professionals who are accredited as High Court Mediators.

General

1. High Court adopted a demarcation policy for the duration of the SOW, which mitigated any risks of closing down the High Court for any period in time.
2. With the exception of one or two staff members and/or judges who were in self-quarantine as 1st contacts (at any given point in time), the court proceeded as usual.
3. Staff and judges who were in self-quarantine simply worked from home as the majority of our litigation is done electronically and therefore accessible from home.
4. At no stage was it necessary to close any of the divisions or services rendered by High Court.

COURT ROLL

Lockdown

1. Court sessions were limited to urgent applications, bail applications and appeals in respect of refusal of bail in the magistrates' Court
2. All cases were postponed from chambers to a date after lockdown

Stages 2, 3 and 4

3. An average of 2 - 4 trials per week had to be postponed due to SOW related reasons, most of which included foreign witnesses and/or counsel or witnesses and/or counsel from restricted districts. These postponements will definitely have a negative impact on future rolls which will ultimately result in backlogs, with extended litigation processes which ultimately amounts to increased litigation costs.

4. The Covid-19 outbreak in the Windhoek correctional facility further amounted to postponements of criminal appeal matters during the past month and will continue until the Correctional facility has been cleared. These postponements amounts a delay in the delivery of justice.
5. The trial awaiting section had until 14 September 2020 no contacts and criminal trials in the High Court proceeded as scheduled. On 15 September 2020 Jaco Kennedy tested positive and the trial awaiting section was isolated. This resulted in criminal appeals not being attended to until end of October 2020.
6. Accused persons and appellants detained outside the Whk restricted area were also not brought for trial or appeal hearings, thus also amounting to the accumulation of a backlog and a delay in the delivery of Justice.
7. Civil appeals, labour appeals and motion proceedings where all litigants are represented by legal practitioners proceeded via zoom where one or more of the practitioners were either in a neighbouring country or couldn't travel to Windhoek, or was in self quarantine.

General observation:

8. The SOE has a definite impact on litigation in the High Court resulting in backlogs with extended litigation which will ultimately lead to increased litigation costs for not only the individual litigants, but also Legal Aid.
9. Number of individuals (including legal practitioners) approximately half of the usual number of persons attending to court during stage 2.
10. Definite increase in the number of winding up applications in court which is indicative of the financial impact the SOW had on individuals and businesses in Namibia.
